ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Female Canadian PGA members and apprentices in good standing
- 2. Any Female Golf Professional
- 3. Canadian amateur golfers who were female at birth. Amateurs and juniors must have an up-to-date RCGA handicap index of 3.4 or lower at time of entry

ENTRY DEADLINE

Entries close at 4:00 p.m. (Eastern Daylight Time) on **Monday, August 9, 2010**. Time limit for entries means time of receipt at Canadian PGA National Office (not time of postmark). Applications late or incomplete are not acceptable. No telephone entries will be accepted. Therefore, contestants are encouraged to allow ample time for mail delays or error in transmission of their entries. Members who desire to play in the Championship MUST submit an entry form prior to the entry deadline. Entries will not be accepted without full remittance of an entry fee.

REFUND POLICY

Entrants who cancel in writing before the entry deadline stated on the applicable entry form will receive a refund of their entry fee. Entrants who cancel after the entry deadline stated on the applicable entry form (up to 12 noon EDT of the Monday of tournament week) will receive a refund minus a \$75 Service Charge plus applicable taxes. There will be no refunds for any reason after Monday (12 noon EDT) of tournament week.

TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION

The Canadian PGA assumes no responsibility for entrants' travel arrangements. Because the tournament may be oversubscribed, the Canadian PGA advises entrants not to book travel or room arrangements prior to confirmation of tournament acceptance unless those arrangements can be cancelled without penalty.

CADDIES

Caddies are permitted but are not mandatory. Limited caddies may be available at the host club. Host clubs will attempt to assist competitors with their caddie requirements, but neither the CPGA nor the host clubs are responsible for securing caddies for competitors. Competitors may carry their own clubs or use a pull cart.

AUTOMOTIVE TRANSPORTATION

Players shall walk at all times during a stipulated round, except when permitted to ride by a Canadian PGA Rules Official. Penalty: Two strokes for each hole at which any breach occurred; maximum penalty per round: four (4) strokes. In the event of a breach between the play of two holes, the penalty applies to the next hole. Use of any unauthorized automotive vehicle shall be discontinued immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred. Otherwise, the player shall be disqualified.

FOOTWEAR - GOLF SPIKES

It is a condition of the competition that shoes with metal or traditionally designed spikes (regardless of composition, i.e., ceramic, plastic, etc.) not be worn. This rule also applies to amateurs in the Pro-Am Day. Penalty for breach of this condition: DISQUALIFICATION.

TIME OF STARTING

All players in a group must be present and READY TO PLAY at the time laid down by the Committee. The order of play is not relevant. READY TO PLAY is defined as being on or near the player's first tee accompanied with the necessary equipment needed to put a ball in play. Notification by a Canadian PGA Rules Official will be given to late starters on the first tee or as soon as practicable.

RULES AND LOCAL RULES

The Rules of the Royal Canadian Golf Association govern play as modified by the Local Rules on the Canadian PGA Rules of Play Card. Supplementary Local Rules will be given to each competitor at the player's first tee. Local Rules on the host club scorecards shall not apply.

CLOSE OF THE COMPETITION

When all scores have been approved by the Canadian PGA, the result of the competition is deemed to have been officially announced and the competition closed.

TIES

Any competitor involved in a playoff, and not immediately available, takes last playoff position. Multiple no-shows for playoffs shall be decided by lot. In the event of ties, prize money will be divided equally among those tied, except that if a competitor wins a play-off for the Championship, he or she will receive first place prize money.
